Cancellation Policy

Cancellations must be in writing (e-mail). Cancellations received less than 48 hours before the start of class will still incur a cost to the student's department. Students will also forfeit any rights to training materials for the class. If there are students on the wait list, the cancelled seat will be filled with the next available student. If there are no wait-listed students, then the student canceling will be responsible for locating a substitute.

Course Details and Descriptions

Excel XP – Protecting Workbooks and Worksheets

Length: Workshop – 2 hours **Level:** Intermediate/Advanced

Prerequisite: Excel XP – Introduction (minimum); Excel XP – Intermediate (recommended)

Description: Excel workbooks and worksheets provide many tools for protecting your work from "accidents"

that other users may cause. In this workshop, students will learn how to use the various protection and password features of Excel to completely lock down a workbook, or leave

portions open for other users to manipulate and view.

Windows XP - Managing Files

Length: Workshop – 2 hours

Level: Introduction

Prerequisite: none

Description: In this workshop, students will learn how to work with files in the Windows XP environment.

Students will learn how to move and copy files, create new folders, create shortcuts to files, and store files in the proper location. Students will also learn the differences between the C:, H:,

and S: drives, and the advantages and disadvantages of each.

Access XP – Introduction

Length: Full day – 7 hours

Level: Introduction

Prerequisite: Excel XP – Introduction

Description: This course teaches students the fundamentals of using Access XP. Students will learn basic

database terms and design concepts, how to plan and create a database, work with tables, create queries with simple and complex criteria, use forms, filter records, and generate reports. Students will learn how to use both the built-in wizards to design database objects, as well as

create the objects from scratch.

Excel XP – Formulas and Functions

Length: Half day – 3.5 hours

Level: Intermediate

Prerequisite: Excel XP - Introduction

Description: This course is a review of the formula-writing skills learned in the Excel Introduction course, as

well as introduce new formula concepts and many useful functions. Students will review the order of operations, basic formula syntax, when to use (and not use) functions in formulas, and how to troubleshoot their formula writing. This course is good for any user who wishes to

become more proficient at writing mathematical formulas in Excel worksheets.

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Word XP - Tables

Length: Half day – 3.5 hours

Level: Intermediate

Prerequisite: Word XP – Introduction

Description: Tables are a powerful formatting tool in Word that have many uses beyond just organizing

information into rows and columns. In this course, students will learn how to create, modify, format, and enhance Word tables in their documents. Additional topics include using the table drawing tools, using AutoFormat, performing simple calculations in tables, moving tables, and

other "lesser known" uses for tables.

Outlook XP – Processing E-mail Automatically Using Rules

Length:Workshop – 2 hoursLevel:Intermediate/AdvancedPrerequisite:Outlook XP – Introduction

Description: Rules are a powerful feature of Outlook for automatically processing incoming e-mail in a variety

of ways. Rules can be designed to run any time e-mail is received, or specifically when a user is marked Out of Office. In this workshop, students will learn how to use Outlook's Rules

Wizard to create rules and the variety of options and conditions associated with rules.

Office XP – Linking and Sharing Data Between Applications NEW!

Length: Workshop – 2 hours

Level: Advanced

Prerequisite: Word XP - Introduction, Excel XP - Introduction, and/or PowerPoint XP - Introduction

Description: All of the Office applications are extremely versatile when it comes to their ability to handle and

have data present from other applications. In this workshop, students will learn how to share and link data across the Office application suite. Topics include learning to use the Enhanced Office Clipboard to copy and paste multiple items across applications, using the Paste Special menu and its options, and understanding the difference between simple copying and pasting

versus creating links to the actual data in other documents.

Access XP – Intermediate

Length: Full day – 7 hours **Level:** Intermediate

Prerequisite: Access XP - Introduction

Description: In this course, students will build upon the skills learned in Access XP Introduction to further

enhance a database, with a primary concentration on topics related to tables. Topics include understanding how to normalize data, creating relationships between tables, implementing referential integrity, creating and using Lookup tables, working with input masks, controlling data entry in tables using validation rules, setting the properties of tables, and how to import table

data from outside sources.
